





BLOCK SCHEDULE

Brown Days and Gold Days alternate every day. Students have 4 classes each day and classes run every other day. All classes are 90 minutes long and lunch periods are 35 minutes. Passing periods are 6 minutes.

Weighted Grades

- Designed to incentivize and reward students for pursuing the most rigorous course of study
- Must take the AP exam or enroll in the college credit through the university


